

(Unconditional Imperatives (love) : Descriptive IFs : Prescriptive IFs)

(1) Election of Grace (History-Covenant) Israel

(2) Commandments NOT means of salvation NOT conditions of Grace = Response Unconditional

(3) Consequences (of obedience + disobedience) Promises Curses "IF" = Descriptive IF

(4) Repentance + Acts of Attonement ("IF")

(5) Forgiveness

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Pharisees (conditional acceptance?)

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Jesus Christ fulfills law submits to condemnation: us (propitiation) Agape Love=fulfilment of law

Holy Spirit union with Christ participation koinonia abiding in Christ Agape

(5) P "no" Believe! Repent! love one another! Walk in light! Agape (Unconditional)

(6) P Consequences (of faith, (repentance, obedience, etc.) + of rejection) forgiveness } peace } life } fellowship, etc. } Agape } salvation
